Dear Ms. Brehm:

This letter is regarding to your Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry (CDC/ATSDR) Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of March 2, 2021, assigned #21-00804-FOIA (copy enclosed).

We located 169 pages of responsive records (all pages released in full or in part). After a careful review of these pages, some information was withheld from release pursuant to 5 U.S.C. §552 Exemption (b)(6).

EXEMPTION 6

Exemption 6 protects information in personnel and medical files and similar files when disclosure would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. The information that has been withheld under Exemption 6 consists of personal information, such as personal email addresses, conference lines, and access codes. We have determined that the individual(s) to whom this information pertains has a substantial privacy interest in withholding it.

In accordance with the Department's implementing regulations, 45 CFR Part 5, no fees are assessed as search costs did not exceed the two allotted free hours.

You may contact our FOIA Public Liaison at 770-488-6277 for any further assistance and to discuss any aspect of your request. 

On additional idea that is more practical than thematic is offering small group consulting sessions to state and local health departments. CDC has often offered those at grantee meetings. Potentially a series of 20- minute sessions over the course of two days that individual HDs sign up for where they can ask questions and get counsel from national comms experts. Once all the sessions have been completed the comms experts could then lead a panel where they discuss the most common questions and insights provided. Access to free, brief consulting might be a new feature to encourage attendance to a virtual conference.

Overview: Hackathon facilitators will guide participants through an interactive brainstorming session to develop a communications campaign that encourages people to resume getting their regular vaccinations (e.g., flu, DTaP, MMR, HPV, pneumonia, shingles, and, eventually, COVID-19) once states and local jurisdictions reopen following COVID-19 shutdowns. The facilitators will briefly present the relevant evidence base (e.g., communications and health behavior theories, audience profiles, evaluation results); help participants identify barriers/resistance to vaccination; advise on research-informed communications strategies/tactics to address barriers and achieve campaign objectives; and identify potential campaign partners and resources. Using an actual and/or virtual whiteboard, the group will then collaborate to establish communications objectives; define primary and secondary target audiences; identify cost effective communication strategies, tactics, and channels; and define evaluation metrics.

Learning Objectives: By the end of the hackathon, participants will be able to:

- Summarize the communications and health behavior theories that will guide the communications campaign.
- Describe five components of an effective communications campaign plan.
- Identify three key performance indicators for measuring campaign impact.

Learning Outcome: "Mini" campaign plan with actionable, customizable implementation steps



Hi board,

Dawn, thank you as always for excellent work.

Next, I apologize since I had to jump off before the meeting concluded, so I want to clarify something. When I left I thought we were in agreement that we are cancelling the In-Person part of the conference with the hotel, but still seeking to hold an event/conference/learning opportunity online, correct?

- 1. If that's not correct and the majority decided to cancel all events in the 2020 timeframe and move on to thinking about going virtual in 2021, then don't bother reading the rest of this 😳
- 2. However, if we are looking to share information in some virtual format during 2020, I would be wary of using the term "Cancellation" so plainly in the June 2 announcement to the Listserv. Some people will need that to cancel their own reservations, but most won't read beyond that and will move to the next event on their list. I would instead suggest *we begin marketing the new format already, even as we gather information*. 






Input from CAB

- I think folks are getting burned out on virtual meetings. On another project of ours where we used to have full-day stakeholder meetings we now don't have meetings longer than 1.5 hrs. People with kids at home cannot do long meetings anymore.
- So I think the only option would be a multi-day event but with a max of 2 hrs a day of content. Could be a "health marketing week" with 2-hour sessions from 10-12 and a mix of events across those 5 days (some plenary, some interactive, etc.)

Todd Philips, Member Conference Advisory Board

Input from CAB

- Keep event timing to August, or possibly September but no later. Perfect time to convene health comm professionals, be it about COVID, flu season, and of course any other health issues we want to tackle on the agenda.
- Make it an event, not an extended series of webinars. The NCHCMM conference is intended to bring the field together across various siloes. An event, even if it's virtual, brings a sense of community that we rarely experience. A webinar series doesn't do that.
- I think that the 2020 Society for Health Comm Summit provides a good model to look to. Attendee feedback via evaluation surveys was very positive, and Terry and I can also share lessons learned about how to make this format work even better. The SHC summit format was two consecutive days, 10:00-2:00 ET each day, with multiple breaks. Each day a series of panels plus a few individual talks, all with a moderated Q&A component at the end of each. Plus one workshop at the end of each day for a limited number of registrants, as well as some informal virtual networking meetups.
- Scheduling simultaneous breakout sessions and tracks, while typical of past NCHCMM conferences, should probably be dropped. Focus on a very focused agenda of topics of use to the entire field, and curate only the <u>best</u> abstract submissions and speakers. Also, drop the idea of virtual cocreation/design workshops. I think these aspects are too much to take on and coordinate well given where we're at.

Input from CAB

- Simultaneous virtual networking meetups, with limited attendance, could be scheduled both days around the main event, framed as 'Ask an Expert' sessions on specific important topics.
- Prep time required—agenda, content and speakers, tech platform—would be very high and intensive but doable.
 - Hard cost expenditures would be low. I don't know anything about NPHIC fiscal considerations that said, I'd recommend keeping registration low, i.e. <\$100. Not free—there needs to be some skin in the game to help motivate attendees to show; but not anywhere near typical NCHCMM registration fee. This fee is quite reasonable compared to other in-person event conference offerings I receive, but in this case it needs to be a low cost of entry to attract attendees to make the event meaningful.

Cancel any 2020 Programming
 Focus on the 2021 Conference Program planning

Pros

Easy implementation

Cons

- Cannot predict the 2021 situation (hard to plan for)
- Potential attendees less certain that an event would be held if current conditions prevail, therefore they may be less likely to consider or commit when making conference plans for 2021
- Similar possibility as above for exhibitors and/or sponsors

- Virtual conference/summit
- Hosted over a 2, 3, 4 days in a week or over a few weeks (for example – HCMM Month)

- General fatigue for online events is a challenge to overcome
- Doing it right requires (at least somewhat) sophisticated technical infrastructure

- "Master Class" concept learning series offered (Oct., 2020, Jan., 2021, March, 2021, June 2021)
- Recorded and available on-demand session(s) featuring "masters" in the fields of HCMM
- Recording will be shared with individuals upon registration, or shortly after, and could be used as baseline knowledge
- Registrants would watch the presentation prior to the Q&A session and develop their questions either during the live Q&A or they can submit questions prior to the event
- Hour long scheduled live Q & A with the "masters" to allow for an interactive experience for participants. A 5minute recap of the previously recorded video will be played prior to live Q&A.

Pros

- Has benefits of trainings
- Potential high appeal if "big names" can be recruited
- Can be an add-on to scenario #2.
- Master Sessions prerecorded, giving Experts flexibility for scheduling
- Attendees can view Master Sessions on their own schedules
- Master Sessions can be edited for A/V clips, etc.
- Marketing/promotion opportunity throughout the year.
 - New concept that's adaptable

Cons

- A different kind of an event compared to NCHCMM, looking like a training series
- Challenges of recruiting big names
- Competing in a crowded market of trainings, some of which are free, is challenging
- Potential Shelf life for content
- Pricing challenge in that attendees can purchase 1 "master class" or a series. Lack of data/experience for determining the ideal price point for either pricing strategy.

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COMMENTS FROM ADVISORY BOARD

Gary Kreps -

This sounds like a very good plan to me Dawn.

It would be good to develop a primary overarching theme that is both current and provocative to use to plan the sessions. Here is an example that I've been thinking about:

"The Changing Digital Landscape for Health Promotion and Wellbeing"

Panels might address relevant current issues such as:

potential attendees. I think Gary's suggestion meets those criteria. I would offer a twist on his suggestion - "Achieving Success in Today's Complex and Diverse Communication Landscape."

Jay Bernhardt –

My opinion is that, while impressive, the amount of work to pull this off would be significant. My suggestion is to scale it back to one, or perhaps two, days of speakers and programming. But, if you go forward with the full plan, I will certainly try to participate.

Tony Foleno –

Looks like a good plan to me! For each day, I only counted three sessions, not four, in what you listed (plenary + 2 sessions), unless you are counting the breaks \bigcirc I think three total per day is fine.

For the 1 hour sessions, I'd suggest that they be limited to two presenters; I've found that with 60 min, 3-4 speakers feels either too rushed or not enough time for Q&A. If you want to include more than 2 presenters, I'd suggest extending to 75 or 90 min.

Some early thoughts on content, based mostly on our previous discussions after the 2020 NCHCMM:

- Less focus on problems/challenges, more on solutions (esp pragmatic how-to solutions)
- More time allotted to interactive Q&A during sessions, more roundtable offerings
- Obviously COVID response should be a big focus once again, but at least some speakers should be on other health issues. One idea – dedicate a plenary session on 'ripple effects' on public health due to COVID – i.e., mental health, addiction, hunger, preventive healthcare.
- Other areas of interest (at least to me): HCP-patient comms; impact measurement of social marketing initiatives
- Would be great if we could get more CDC & HHS representation, not just attendees but also senior leadership presenters – e.g. Dr. Wollensky as keynote

Todd Philips –

I agree with having a virtual conference. I like the idea of having a plenary session and then 2 to 4 concurrent breakout sessions each day to give participants some options of topics.

Hi Dawn-

Thanks for your note. Sharing a few thoughts below for your consideration. But first I wanted to say that I feel for you and the team at CDC and NPHIC. For conferences that are earlier, it's a simple, though regrettable, decision. But with an August date I can understand your predicament. I don't have a strong opinion to push, but my sense is that you're going to have to cancel. Personally, I've been looking to Italy as a 'leading indicator' of how things will unfold in the US. That said, I understand that others on this note—with more expertise and/or optimism than I have—may strongly disagree. And I recognize that it's an overly facile comparison given differences in circumstances, health care systems, timing and type of mitigation efforts, etc.

Either way, it's reassuring to know that the conference decision makers in this case are CDC-affiliated. It's not like I'm waiting to hear back about the National Association of Vacuum Cleaner Retailers conference. ©

It think it might be helpful for this group to know if you have any sense of the time window for your decision, i.e. 'If we are still unsure by Date X, we will have to pull the plug.'

In the meantime, I'm happy to contribute to Terry's subcommittee, though I hope you can understand that my bandwidth right now is quite limited. Things are extremely busy at the Ad Council these days, as I'm sure it is for many of you. I am not complaining, because it involves the opportunity to be part of work to help support the CDC's mission at this time, as well as a lot of other work around COVID-19 response. (That's a whole other email!)

My main comment is about programming, whether the conference happens this year or next: Our current reality bears no resemblance to the world that we were living in when conference planning commenced. This is a seminal moment for our field, with far-reaching lessons to be learned and shared. Not just for health communication professionals working in infectious diseases and pandemic response, but all of us.

Moreover, the negative consequences to the public's health will likely be long-term and profound, exacerbated by an economic recession that many experts are predicting. I work on many health-related campaigns—such as suicide prevention, adolescent mental health, and hunger prevention—and we're already discussing how we should work to address the ripple effects of the COVID-19 crisis on these issues, both now and over the long term.

My comments are not brilliant or unique, I know. I'm guessing that most if not all of those on this email are thinking about the same kind of things. This is just my roundabout way of suggesting that we rethink programming content to more squarely focus on what's happening now, what's to come as a result, and what our field can do about it.

Just my two cents – I hope it's helpful. And I hope everyone is faring ok, or at least as ok as can be expected.



Panel #1

Addressing Health Equity and Social Justice Issues during a Pandemic: What is the Role of the Health, Marketing and Media Professional? (90 minutes)

Overview

The COVID-19 Pandemic has quickly exposed the longstanding fault lines in our nation's public health system. Communities around the country are now grappling with the convergence of a deadly virus along with widespread public demand for social and economic change. This growing awareness of the inequalities and injustices burdening communities of color has now propelled an already stressed public health system into the forefront a new civil rights movement.

Our panel of experts will examine the role public health, its communicators, marketers and the media now play in driving awareness and understanding to the disproportionate health and economic impacts of the pandemic in communities of color, and how biased social systems drive systemic inequities in health, the economy, and criminal justice.

The panel will discuss the unique challenges faced in communicating effective public health interventions such as COVID-19 contact tracing and testing.

Our experts will share their advice on how to look for opportunities in culturally diverse communities to leverage traditional and social media as well as the engagement of stakeholders to build trust and lasting relationships in communities with an excessive burden of poor health outcomes.

The session will also highlight policy recommendations such as "health in all policies" and "racism as a public health crisis" as growing public health initiatives in the national fight for health equity.

Audience

Public health professionals in all settings but specifically communicators, educators, marketers, community health organizers and others in governmental public health, non-profit health organizations and clinical health systems.

Learning Objectives

- Understand the marketing and communication challenges in communities of color and the importance of bridging trust gaps
- Learn the do's and don'ts of key messaging and examine the implications of developing effective public health awareness and education campaigns
- Identify what the key social determinants of health impacting equity and outcomes
- Learn some of the innovative and effective policy approaches to address social inequities

This subject area will lay the groundwork for a general discussion around the excessive burden of health inequities on communicates of color. Invited panelists will include one of the following: Dr. Camara Jones, Adjunct Professor and Senior Fellow, Morehouse School of Medicine; Kierra S. Barnett, PhD MPH, Post-Doctoral Researcher, Kirwan Institute for the Study of Race and Ethnicity at the Ohio State University or Dr. Garth Walker, an emergency room physician and SDoH research expert.
- Social Media and Culture: Proposed panelists include a representative from from A/B Partners, a minority-owned public relations firm focusing in community change, politics and culture; Facebook, need I say more; or Kerry Shearer, a communications professional with skills in crisis response, social media outreach, marketing campaigns, audio and video production, news reporting, broadcasting and webcasting.

NOTE: Other experts are being considered but the final slate would include no more than five panelists.

Dan Rutz is a public health consultant and adjunct faculty member at Emory University where he teaches health communications. Panel Participants' Roles, Responsibilities and Key Points

Panel: Addressing Health Equity and Social Justice Issues during a Pandemic: What is the Role of the Health, Marketing and Media Professional? (90-minutes)

Goal: This diverse panel of experts will examine how the role of public health communications has shifted with the unexpected convergence of a pandemic response, calls for social justice change and public demand for equitable health outcomes for all, especially in communities of color. The panel will outline these new communication challenges and provide practical solutions for implementing effective awareness, education, and outreach strategies in this multilayered public health threat environment.

Panel Organizers:

- Develop panel opening remarks for the moderator to set the stage for the discussion
- Identify the key points each presenter should make and work with them to hone their messages
- Develop a run of show to ensure each element of the panel is covered (i.e. opening/closing, timekeeping, A/V & technical support, notetaker/Q&A facilitator etc.)
- Determine format (look, feel, tone and pace of the full panel presentation)

Moderator:

- Sets the stage for the discussion by articulating how the COVID-19 pandemic and current social justice issues in the U.S. have merged to create a multi public health threat. (Opening remarks will be developed by the panel organizers).
- Introduce each speaker with a quick background of his/her credentials
- Toss questions to each panelist that are specific to their backgrounds. Allow each panelist to expound on their opening key points
- Facilitate deeper discussions that emerge
- Interject media expectations and applicable journalist anecdotes
- Allow for audience participation when prompted
- Keep discussion focused on outcomes for effective communication, home in on interesting and innovative ideas and pivot as discussions develop
- Close out panel with a highlight of what was learned.

Panelists (Key Teaching Points)

Social Determinants of Health: Academic Researcher

- Briefly define social determinants of health and describe those factors impacting equity and health outcomes in communities of color.
- Provide a brief historical background on social practices that have disenfranchised people of color.
- Describe the tools researchers now use (geo-mapping etc.) to identify at-risk, and underserved communities more effectively.

- Explain ways communicators can use these tools for education and awareness purposes.
- Share examples of communities that have developed effective education and awareness interventions.

Local Public Health: Franklin County, Ohio

- Describe the overarching factors that prompted your county to declare racism a public health crisis.
- Give the timeline of your declaration in relationship to the COVID-19 virus outbreak and how that may have factored into that decision or changed the focus of the declaration.
- Explain how the social justice protests (which occurred after your declaration) changed or influenced your efforts.
- Indicate the most significant communication challenges and how your organization worked to overcome them.
- Describe supportive organizations and trusted messengers that were relied on in your community.

Public Health Communicator: Hennepin County, MN

- As the City of Minneapolis became the epicenter of the civil unrest that spread across the nation, give a summary of the communication challenges your organization faced with the unexpected convergence of a pandemic and growing civil unrest.
- Provide several strategies you used to effectively develop and communicate important public health messages.
- Discuss your thoughts on ways you could have been better prepared or resourced to respond more effectively.
- Give examples of the most important lessons you are learning.

Marketing/Advertising Organization: The Ad Council

- Outline the strategies used, and the types of collateral materials developed, by your organization to immediately respond to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Share examples of the most effective communication tools/ads and explain why they seemed to resonate.
- Provide tips on how to develop more effective communication strategies and tactics
- Share the communication dos and don'ts when responding in a public health crisis.

Social Media & Culture: New and Traditional Social Media Experts/Digital Journalists and the Cultural Divide

Achieving Understanding and Acceptance of COVID-19 Vaccination: How Do Recent Survey Research Findings Help Inform Communication Strategies and Messaging?

Overview

Domestically and globally, significant investments have been made in developing as fast as possible safe and effective vaccines to prevent COVID-19. Researchers around the world are developing more than 155 vaccines against the coronavirus, and 23 vaccines are in human trials (New York Times, July 16). In the U.S., five vaccine projects are receiving billions of dollars in federal funding before there is evidence that the vaccines work as part of the government's Operation Warp Speed program. Moderna, the first American company to put a vaccine into human trials, expects to being Phase III clinical trials on July 27 and hopes to have vaccine doses ready by early 2021. The vaccine uses messenger RNA (mRNA for short) to produce viral proteins – a technology not currently used in any licensed U.S. vaccines.

Community (i.e., herd) immunity is believed necessary to end the COVID-19 pandemic, and vaccines are considered the only viable way to achieve it. Most experts estimate that at least 60%-70% of the U.S. population would need to be immune to COVID-19 to achieve community immunity. If the initially available vaccines are 70% effective, then about 90% of the entire population would need to be vaccinated to achieve community immunity thresholds.

Since it is unlikely that COVID-19 vaccination would be mandatory, particularly for most U.S. adults, education and persuasion will need to be key components of vaccination efforts. There is also much recognition, and many recent calls (e.g., editorials and columns in leading medical journals and news media outlets), that COVID-19 education and communication efforts begin immediately; that is, concurrent with vaccine development and trials. Those calls have noted that COVID-19 vaccination education/communication campaigns be informed by public and community perspectives.

Many entities with experience in health and vaccination public health campaigns have been doing survey research, including longitudinal assessments, to identify the beliefs and intentions of U.S. adults with respect to COVID-19 vaccines and vaccinations. These include RTI, ICF, Pew Research Center, and the University of Chicago's National Opinion Research Center. Most surveys have found ~50% of people in the U.S. are strongly interested in receiving a COVID-19 vaccine, with at least 25%-30% indicating they are unlikely. They have also surfaced many demographic differences as well as insights into beliefs associated with hesitancy and refusal.

To advance COVID-19 vaccination education and communication efforts, the objectives of this session are two-fold: 1) highlight findings and insights from recent national surveys involving COVID-19 vaccination beliefs and acceptance as way to increase visibility among those involved and likely to be involved in COVID-19 vaccination efforts; and 2) identify and describe ways that available survey findings and insights can be used to inform COVID-19 vaccination campaigns and messaging.

Session Format

Two or three speakers who would highlight what has been learned regarding COVID-19 vaccine based on survey research to date. These speakers would be asked to highlight findings and insights that they believe should or could inform COVID-19 vaccination education and communication strategies and

messaging. Presentations should not only highlight barriers and challenges to COVID-19 vaccination acceptance but findings and insights that could help overcome those barriers and challenges. Presentations would be 15-minutes in length.

Two or three speakers involved in vaccination and/or health-related communication campaigns and messaging who would focus on how the available survey research findings can be used to inform and shape COVID-19 vaccination campaigns and messages. It is often recommended that vaccination communication campaigns and messages be "evidence informed." This part of the session would revolve around discussing how available survey evidence could be used. Presentation would be 15-minutes in length.

<u>Proposed Moderator</u>: Glen Nowak, Professor, and Director, Center for Health & Risk Communication, Grady College of Journalism and Mass Communication, University of Georgia, Athens, GA.

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The Power of Language is Beyond Words

The stage: The Republican National Convention, 2008. Vice President nominee Sarah Palin with her husband and five children put forward to America and in the press as the image of family values. Five kids, ages 19 to newborn. Baby on a national stage barefoot. Oldest daughter holding the hand of her boyfriend and father to the baby of the unwed couple. Not casting judgement but painting a picture to ask: Would this family be praised in the media, in America, for exemplifying this country's family values if they had been Black?


The story we would have told and the image our audiences would takeaway would have been very different. Afterall, it was merely a few months later First Lady Michelle Obama was heavily criticized for merely wearing a sleeveless dress.

As communicators in today's America we need to come to terms with the reality of privilege and double standards. We think of privilege as an advantage that helps people get something. But it goes deeper: it is pervasive in the stories we tell, the language we use and the narratives that are interpreted very differently based on race, gender, class... privilege.

I learned this lesson a decade earlier. In 1998, I was part of building PeachCare for Kids in Georgia, part of the largest expansion of health care coverage since the creation of Medicare. Our initial campaign, "Now You Can Afford Peace of Mind," launched with a campaign featuring a stunning picture of an African American dad loving on his child. The campaign won industry awards and praise throughout the state. The love of this man for his newborn, the strength in his embrace, the tenderness of the smile. It captivated.

It was exciting to stand behind communication that so powerfully positioned African American fathers. But there was an underside. What if the single person featured in the ad had been female? Or, what if the parent had been an African American female? What backstory would people have written?

Our television spot, "Emma," featured a mother and her soccerplaying son. We very deliberately had the camera focus on Emma's



wedding ring and Happy Father's Day drawings on the refrigerator. We knew what had to be done to keep PeachCare from being viewed as another governement program that just helps single "welfare" moms. We knew it in the name of political savviness. We spoke of it in terms of "not feeding into stereotypes." But what it really is at its heart: emblems of white and male privlege.

Last week, Vice President and presumptive Democratic nominee Joe Biden announced Senator Kamala Harris as his running mate, and they will take the stage in another national party convention this week. The first Black woman and the first person of Indian descent to be nominated for national office by a major party. In reaction to this news, President Trump called her "nasty." While these egregious examples of language that would not be used to describe men on the national campaign trail, Senator Lindsey Graham called her "aggressive." Subtle. A term that would be used to build up a man, is used to diminsh a woman.

As communicators and marketers we know language has power. In the current environment with People of Color being disproportionately impacted by COVID-19. With Whites engaging in tough conversations about race, injustice and systemic issues. And now with the first vice presidential candidate being a woman of color, we have to pay attention to language. It is our craft to know the power of words. What we say. Nuance. But we also need to be aware of how our messages play into the biases and narratives our consumers bring to the conversation. And as consumers of these messages, we need to see them for what they are.

We saw Sarah Palin's family. We heard the promise of a return to family values. We didn't think twice. A privilege of being White. Inclusion is not simply representation of minorities in our ads and television shows. It is allowing Blacks to stand on the stage as the Palin family did and be seen with the same humanity.

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

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

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

That's a good observation. Perhaps a theme related to that could be something along the lines of "Communicating in a world where vision isn't 2020"
