2nd Letter Subject: Final Response Letter

Dear Mr. Siri:

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry (CDC/ATSDR) received your November 22, 2021, Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request on November 22, 2021, seeking:

“Please provide all deidentified documents sufficient to show the total number of confirmed cases within the United States of COVID-19 re-infection.

As defined by the CDC, reinfection is when a person was infected with COVID-19 once, recovered, and then later became infected with COVID-19 again. <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/reinfection.html>”

We located one page of responsive records. After a careful review of this page, no information was withheld from release. Additionally, the CDC Emergency Operations Center (EOC) conveyed that:

- 1) *Only 4 jurisdictions populated results;*
- 2) *Response includes data which has not been examined/analyzed; and*
- 3) *Data quality has not been checked.*

Reinfection was defined as answering Yes to the question "Did the patient previously meet the case definition for a probable or confirmed case of SARS-CoV-2?"
