Dear Mr. Siri:

This letter is in response to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request submitted to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) on behalf of your client, the Informed Consent Action Network (ICAN). OMB assigned this FOIA request tracking number 2021-420.

Pursuant to our email exchange on November 4, 2021 about the scope of your request, OMB is making its fourth rolling production. Specifically, OMB has reviewed an additional 300 potentially responsive records. Of the 300 documents reviewed this past month, OMB determined that 86 documents are responsive to your FOIA request. OMB is releasing all 86 documents with partial redactions. The 86 documents being released in part include redactions made pursuant to FOIA Exemptions 5 and 6, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(5), (b)(6). Exemption 5 protects interagency or intra-agency pre-decisional and deliberative communications, the disclosure of which would inhibit the frank and candid exchange of views that is necessary for effective government decision making. Exemption 6 protects against disclosure of information that would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. We have reviewed the information protected by these exemptions under a presumption of openness, but have determined that it is reasonably foreseeable that disclosure of the information would harm an interest protected by the applicable exemption(s).

OMB will continue to process potentially responsive records and will follow up with an additional rolling production by May 31, 2022, with successive productions on an approximately monthly cadence thereafter.

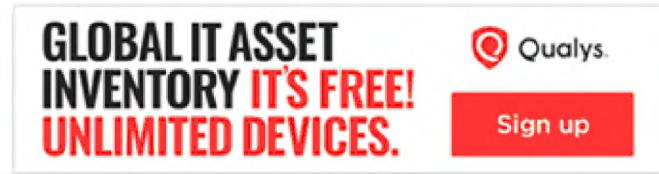

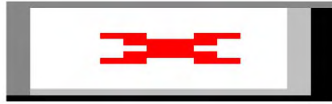

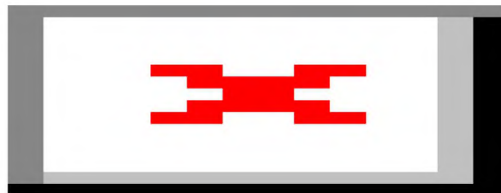

Presidential contender Mike Bloomberg's spree of often-surreal social media memes is having one concrete impact — it prompted Facebook to make another change Friday in its rules for paid political content.

From now on, Facebook and its Instagram subsidiary will allow "branded content" from political candidates — a practice in which a campaign pays so-called influencers to place supportive posts on their accounts. Previously, a Facebook spokesperson said, the platforms had banned such content from politicians by default.

Under the new rules, the new rules will have to be clearly marked as sponsored.

The spokesperson said in a statement that the rule change had been under consideration for some time, with meme posts gaining traction as a campaign tool, and with both political campaigns and government agencies inquiring about the company's policies on their use. Bloomberg drew new attention to the issue this week after paying influential Instagram personalities to post a series of posts meant to look as if the Democratic contender were sending oddball direct messages to the influencer, such as "I put Lamborghini doors on the Escalade."

The New York Times reported Thursday that the Bloomberg campaign is working with a company called Meme 2020 to produce sponsored posts to run on third-party accounts. They bore the disclaimer: "yes this is really #sponsored by @mikebloomberg."

"After hearing from multiple campaigns, we agree that there's a place for branded content in political discussion on our platforms," the Facebook spokesperson said. "We're allowing US-based political candidates to work with creators to run this content, provided the political candidates are authorized and the creators disclose any paid partnerships through our branded content tools."

However, Facebook won't treat the sponsored content — which are a financial transaction between two outside parties — in exactly the same way it treats political ads, from which Facebook gets a cut.

Sponsored political posts won't be included in the library of political ads that the company launched after the 2016 U.S. presidential election, unless the posts are converted into paid advertisements using the site's so-called boosting tools. And unlike candidates' ads, sponsored political posts could be subject to fact-checking if the message of the sponsored posts is in the voice of the third-party poster, and not the candidate.

Previously, Facebook had prohibited sponsored posts by campaigns as part of a broader ban on political entities' use of a suite of tools that involve financial transactions, like subscription services and so-called ad breaks. It had banned them out of fear that those practices could be considered campaign contributions by Facebook.

But Facebook points out that, unlike with paid ads, it has no role in the money changing hands behind sponsored posts.

"Branded content is different from advertising, but in either case we believe it's important people know

when they're seeing paid content on our platforms," the spokesperson said.

Candidates' use of paid memes still falls in a gray area of federal election law, a gap unlikely to be filled by Election Day.

A spokesperson for the Federal Election Commission told POLITICO that "commission regulations do not explicitly address social media influencers."

"Public communications that expressly advocate the election or defeat of a candidate for federal office and placed on the Internet for a fee must include a disclaimer to inform that public of the identify that entity that paid for the communication," said the spokesperson, who also alluded to the fact that three of the FEC's six seats are vacant. "As you may already know, the agency is currently operating without a working quorum, and as a result, the Commission is unable to move forward at the moment on any new rulemakings."

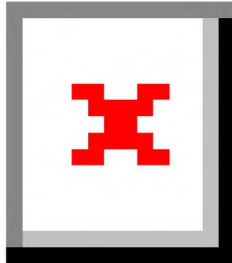

In addition to ensuring there is good information delivered to the public on the most direct preparedness and response around the outbreak of the virus itself (which CDC is leading with their website) we're also trying to facilitate good information around how specific agencies are responding and other downstream impacts to government services caused by the crisis - while also seeing what analytics are available to better inform us of those impacts. You'll notice the CDC website links to the section of [usa.gov/coronavirus](https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus) with related information from a variety of agencies and mission areas.

I know it will be difficult to schedule this, but I think 3:30pm or 4pm ET tomorrow on March 18th could work for us. 4pm ET on March 19th could work too. If those don't work for you, please let us know what would be best. Something toward the end of the day here on the east coast will probably have less meeting conflicts. 30min should be sufficient.

The U.K.'s strategy, which markedly contrasts the EU's own AI proposed rules, indicates that it's embracing the freedom that comes from not being tied to Brussels, and that it's keen to ensure that freedom delivers it an economic boost.

In the strategy, the country sets out how the U.K. will invest in AI applications and help other industries integrate artificial intelligence into their operations. Absent from the strategy are its plans on how to regulate the tech, which has already demonstrated potential harms, like the [exams scandal last year](#) in which an algorithm downgraded students' predicted grades.

The government will present its plans to regulate AI early next year.

Speaking at an event in London, Philp said the U.K. government wants to take a "pro-innovation" approach to regulation, with a light-touch approach from the government.

"We intend to keep any form of regulatory intervention to a minimum," the minister said. "We will seek to use existing structures rather than setting up new ones, and we will approach the issue with a permissive mindset, aiming to make innovation easy and straightforward, while avoiding any public harm while there is clear evidence that exists."

Despite the strategy's ambition, the lack of specific policy proposals in it means industry will be watching out for what exactly a "pro-innovation" policy will look like, according tech lobby TechUK's Katherine Holden.

"The U.K. government is trying to strike some kind of healthy balance within the middle, recognizing that there's the need for appropriate governance and regulatory structures to be put in place... but make sure it's not at the detriment of innovation," said Holden.

Break out, or fit in?

The U.K.'s potential revisions to its data protection rules are one sign of what its strategy entails. The country is considering scrapping a rule that prohibits automated decision-making without human oversight, arguing that it stifles innovation.

Like AI, the government considers its data policy [as an instrument to boost growth](#), even as a [crucial data flows agreement](#) with the EU relies on the U.K. keeping its own data laws equivalent to [the EU's](#).

A divergent approach to AI regulation could make it harder for U.K.-based AI developers to operate in the EU, which will likely finalize its own AI laws next year.

"If this is tending in a direction which is diverging substantially from EU proposals on AI, and indeed the GDPR [the EU's data protection rules] itself, which is so closely

linked to AI, then we would have a problem,” said Timothy Clement-Jones, a former chair of the House of Lords’ artificial intelligence liaison committee.

Clement-Jones was also skeptical of the U.K.’s stated ambition to become a global AI standard-setter. “I don’t think the U.K. has got the clout to determine the global standard,” Clement-Jones said. “We have to make sure that we fit in with the standards” he said, adding that the U.K. needs to continue to work its AI diplomacy in international fora, such as at the OECD and the Council of Europe.

In its [AI Act](#), the European Commission also sets out a plan to boost AI innovation, but it will strictly regulate applications that could impinge on fundamental rights and product safety, and includes bans for some “unacceptable” uses of artificial intelligence such as government-conducted social scoring. The EU institutions will be far along in their legislative work on AI by the time the U.K. comes out with its own proposal.

“Depending on the timeline for AI regulation pursued by Brussels, the U.K. runs the risk of having to harmonize with EU AI rules if it doesn’t articulate its own approach soon,” said Carly Kind, the director of the Ada Lovelace Institute, which researches AI and data policy.

“If the UK wants to live up to its ambition of becoming an AI superpower, the development of a clear approach to AI regulation needs to be a priority,” Kind said.
