Dear Mr. Siri:

This letter is in response to your Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry (CDC/ATSDR) Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of May 2, 2022, seeking:

"All data, gathered in the effort to recalculate hospitalizations during the pandemic, reflecting: 1. The number of people who were admitted to a hospital due to COVID-19; and 2. The and the number of individuals who were admitted to a hospital for reasons other than COVID-19 and tested positive after being admitted. Information helpful to fulfilling this request: "Biden officials trying to recalculate U.S. Covid-19 hospitalizations" https://www.politico.com/news/2022/02/07/biden-covid-hospitalization-data-recalculate-00006341."

COVID-NET collects data from a network of approximately 300 hospitals within a defined catchment area that represents about 10% of the U.S. population. COVID-NET does not work with hospitals nationwide, and COVID-NET has not been involved in efforts to "recalculate" hospitalizations nationwide due to COVID/other reasons.

The most up to date data on the number of people who were admitted to a hospital due to COVID-19 can be found at the public facing CDC COVID-19 Data Tracker (please follow this link - https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#new-hospital-admissions). As of 5/17, the number of people admitted to a hospital due to COVID-19 was 4.68M.

In response to item #2 of your request, we do not have this data available. The way that our data guidance defines COVID admission does not enable us to make a distinction between hospital admissions due to COVID-19 vs. hospital admissions for reasons other than COVID-19.
