Good morning Mr. Harper,

As for the objection that the request is not limited in time, this request is only for *current* studies that the CDC relies upon (as the request states, it is only for studies regarding the safety of “injecting infants and children”). To avoid any doubt, the instant FOIA request is for the human or animal studies involving the subcutaneous or intramuscular injection of aluminum adjuvant that the CDC *currently* relies upon for the safety of injecting infants and children with aluminum hydroxide, aluminum phosphate or amorphous aluminum hydroxyphosphate sulfate.

As for the objection that the request did not reasonably describe the records sought, the request is plainly requesting specific studies for a specific age group regarding the safety of a specific substance that the CDC asserts on its website is safe for injection into that specific age group. This request is extremely specific and is requesting studies that CDC should have readily available.

Please advise if CDC is withdrawing is too broad objection.
