## Dear Sir or Madam:

This firm represents Informed Consent Action Network ("ICAN"). On behalf of ICAN, we are requesting records pursuant to the California Public Records Act (Government Code §6250-6268) from the files of the California Department of Public Health.

By this letter, please provide the following in California Department of Public Health's possession to <a href="mailto:foia@sirillp.com">foia@sirillp.com</a>:

- (1) All de-identified documents concerning cases of COVID-19 Vaccine breakthrough infections within the state of California.<sup>1</sup>
- (2) All de-identified documents concerning cases of reinfection with COVID-19 within the state of California.

Please note that the Public Records Act provides that if only portions of a requested file are exempted from release, the remainder must still be released. We, therefore, request that we be provided with all non-exempt portions which are reasonably segregable. We further request that you describe any deleted or withheld material in detail and specify the statutory basis for the denial as well as your reasons for believing that the alleged statutory justification applies. Please also

separately state your reasons for not invoking your discretionary powers to release the requested documents in the public interest. Such statements may help to avoid unnecessary appeal and litigation. ICAN, of course, reserves all rights to appeal the withholding or deletion of any information.

Access to the requested records should be granted within five (5) business days from the date of your receipt of this letter. Failure to respond in a timely manner shall be viewed as a denial of this request, and ICAN may immediately file an administrative appeal.
